### How do I file an At-Risk Youth Petition?

- Custodial Parent/Legal Guardian needs to call Children's Administration at 585-3000
- 2. Select #1 for English, select #1 (make a report of child abuse or neglect)
- 3. Select #1 for Family Reconciliation Services
- 4. When speaking to Intake, state that you are requesting an At-Risk Youth Petition. The intake person will ask you numerous questions about the situation with your child
- 5. After talking with Intake, your request will be referred to a case worker who will call you to set up an appointment
- 6. The case worker will meet with you and <u>if</u> appropriate, will give you the paperwork to file the petition
- 7. You will take your completed paperwork to the Benton Franklin Counties Juvenile Justice Center where it will be assigned to a probation counselor
- 8. The probation counselor will contact you regarding signing of paperwork and setting of court hearing

## Is my child an At-Risk Youth?

The law defines an At-Risk Youth as an individual under the age of 18 years who:

- Is absent from home for more than 72 consecutive hours without consent of his/her parent(s)/guardian(s); or
- 2: Is beyond the control of his/her parent(s)/guardian(s) such that the child's behavior substantially endangers the health, safety, or welfare of the child or another person; or
- Has a serious substance abuse problem for which there are no pending charges related to substance abuse.

#### What is the purpose of an At-Risk Youth Petition?

The purpose of this legislation is to empower parents; to use court intervention as a last resort to keep youth at home or in an alternate safe placement.

#### What happens after I file an At-Risk Youth Petition?

- 1. The court will appoint an attorney to represent your child.
- 2. A hearing is set and notice is given to all parties.
- 3. If the petition is approved by the court, then the court will order the youth to certain terms which <u>may</u> include:
  - Reside at home or an alternative placement
  - Attend school
  - Curfew
  - No use of drugs or alcohol, random urinalysis testing, drug/alcohol counseling
  - Attend individual and/or family counseling

# What happens if my child doesn't follow the terms of the At-Risk Youth Petition?

- The parent/guardian must report the violation to the probation counselor.
- The violation will be set for a hearing and the Judge will determine if your child is in contempt.
- 3. If your child is found in contempt, they may be ordered to complete community service hours, serve days on the work crew, or serve days in detention.
